What is the study about?

The purpose of this study is to help us learn how sickle cell anemia (SCA) affects how the brain works and thinking skills, by comparing children with SCA to children without SCA over time.

Who can participate?

We are looking for English-speaking participants between 6.0 to 16.0 years old who are in good general health and **do not have SCA**.

What's involved?

You will be asked to come to SickKids for two (2) inperson study visits, taking place about 2 years apart. Each study visit is expected to take about 6 hours (with breaks) and will involve:

- 1. Taking pictures of your brain with MRI ~ 1 hour
- Recording how your brain sends messages with magnetoencephalography (MEG) ~ 1 hour
- 3. Cognitive (thinking) tasks ~ 2 hours
